Organize safe alley walks and review crime reports with BPD to identify where we can make a difference including:

Improvements in street lighting, affixing street numbers on rear gates, ensuring adequate locking of doors and fences, clearing out of alleys to allow for emergency services access.



Developers

Work with developers to deliver win-win solutions that encourage investment in our community, whilst respecting the interests and concerns of residents and the City of Boston building codes and guidelines.

Socials

Organize socials (BBQs, stoop parties and seasonal celebrations at The Eagle) to bring neighbors together and seek out areas of common interest.
